

Styles of Fire Distribution Box Identification Signs

Please verify with the Fire Marshal's Office for the correct verbiage and requirements for required signs. Due to some unique building arrangement, there may be other specific signage that may be required.

4.1.2.1 This chapter shall provide uniform fire safety symbols to improve communication wherever signs and symbols are employed to provide fire safety information.

All valve signs, hydraulic design signs, and general information signs must be a "permanently marked weatherproof metal or rigid plastic identification signs secured with corrosion-resistant wire, chain, or ...

Signs shall be 12" x 18" aluminum with red reflective letters on white reflective background posted not more than 100 feet apart along the length of the Fire Lane.
