

The bridge is located at Jinja city (the second capital of Uganda after Kampala) across the Victoria Nile, between the source of the Nile to the south and Nalubaale Power Station (old bridge) to the north.

The New Nile Bridge's uniqueness is in it being the longest single-plane cable configuration with a waterproof deck on the entire African Continent.

The damage had been caused by erosion of the main pillars of the bridge which were constructed more than 40 years ago. The erosion had been escalated by increased volume of waters in River Malaba, ...

The new Nile bridge which was financed by the Japanese government, is a cable stayed bridge at 500 meters upstream of Nalubaale Dam.

Demand for such structures is actually high given that Uganda is endowed with many lakes, rivers, streams and swamps. Further, many of the bridging structures constructed during the colonial era ...

The New Jinja Bridge (also known as Second Nile Bridge) is built across Nile River connecting the town of Njeru to Jinja, which is part of International Trunk Road (east-west direction) of Kampala (Capital) ...
